AR 403: Current Trends in Nigerian Architecture Assignments

Assignment One:

Students should form groups with a maximum of 3 (three) students per group. Each group should select one of the topics listed below and prepare a term paper or report formatted on A4 paper. The paper should be 10 – 15 pages long, including photographs, tables, figures and other illustrations. The paper will be assessed based on both content and presentation. The maximum score for the paper is 15 marks, but submissions in electronic format (on CD or by email) will attract a maximum of 4 bonus marks, subject to a maximum of 15 marks.

Students are advised to pay particular attention to paper organization and structure, language, spelling and quality of illustrations. Sample projects from last year along with the marks awarded will be posted on the web site sdngnet.com for guidance. These previous submissions may have been adjusted for clarity of presentation.

Submission in Microsoft Word format is preferred, although high resolution graphics may be saved into a subdirectory and linked to the document.

Students should specify their preferred paper topic by indicating their matriculation number and full name against the preferred project topic.

Assignment Two:

Using the groups formed for assignment one, each group should select a firm of architects registered in Nigeria. Briefly describe the formation and structure of the firm.

Select 3 (three) representative and built projects by the firm and do a proper critique of these projects. Indicate the location, client, year of design, year of completion, cost, design objectives and other comments. Using floor plans and photographs / sketches, describe the form and functional layout of the building, stating clearly the architectural style of the design. Include other comments as necessary.

Students are advised to pay particular attention to paper organization and structure, language, spelling and quality of illustrations. The paper should be on A4 paper and should be 10 – 15 pages long, including plans, photographs, tables, figures and other illustrations. The paper will be assessed based on both content and presentation. The maximum score for the paper is 15 marks, but submissions in electronic format (on CD or by email) will attract a maximum of 4 bonus marks, subject to a maximum of 15 marks.

Submission in Microsoft Word format is preferred, although high resolution graphics may be saved into a subdirectory and linked to the document.
